

# On Our Cover

Rev. John Peach by David G Pitt, Encyclopedia of Newfoundland and Labrador. John Peach was born Woodford, Ireland. After several years in secular pursuits, in 1835 he entered the work of the Methodist Church. Volunteering for service overseas in 1839, he was posted to Newfoundland. After a probationary term at Hant's Harbour-Old Perlican, he was ordained in 1842. Initially stationed at Burgeo, he was shortly transferred to fill a sudden vacancy at Grand Bank, where he remained until 1844 and married a daughter of William Evans of that place. After pastorates on the east coast, including Twillingate, he returned to the Burin Peninsula, serving Burin, and again Grand Bank. Anxious to further Methodism on the southwest coast, he travelled extensively, preaching in many isolated communities. In the Summer of 1858, he did the same in Labrador. Stationed thereafter at Lower Island Cove, Brigus, Carbonear and Blackhead, he retired in 1876, but served as president of the Conference in 1882-83. For nearly 20 years he was also chairman of the board of the Wesleyan Academy (later Methodist College). He died at Blackhead on September 18, 1891. References: D.W. # Behold I am making all things new!

Revelations 21:5

I can hardly believe it, but the Summer has passed and I have been serving the Gower family and sharing in ministry with you for almost a year now. This year has been transformative in so many ways- the blessings, joys and challenges that come with walking with a new group of people has truly continued to shape not only my ministry, but also my spirit.

I thank all of you for your love, support, and patience as I was immersed into this community of faith, learning the ropes and building relationships.

The July sun has set, the August rain has fallen and the cooler Fall breeze blows through the trees among us, marking yet again another change in season.

Over the past few weeks I have been reading the work of Christian writer Joyce Rupp and as we move into this new season, her Autumn reflections in "The Circle of Life," in particular have been springing to my mind more and more often. Let go of those negative voices that tell us we are not good enough, not smart enough, not gifted enough- recognizing, of course, that often these voices are our own.

Let go of petty practices of judgment and critique that harm our relationships. Let go of tolerating and embrace celebrating.

Let go of that thing that has been weighing on your mind.

We all have one... a paper that is due soon? Making a phone call to a loved one? Finally cleaning out the basement after putting it off for the last 6 months? Let go of feeling alone. God is with us. We are NEVER alone.

I wish you a beautiful Autumn season. I hope in the middle of all the busyness, committee meetings, family get-togethers, school and whatever else is written in our calendars that you are still able to find time to reflect, let go, and restore your spirits.

The following is a quick update to the 2019 priorities which we established last Spring:

- 1. **Ministry of Children, Youth & Young Families:** As you all know by now Rebecca Pike has joined us and is working part time and already has some great plans for the Fall.
- 2. **Increasing alternate sources of income**: Ken Peters will be chairing a Committee which will be working throughout the Fall to produce a report prior to Christmas. The Annual Dinner Theatre was a great success again this year netting almost \$3800. In addition the Summer Soiree organized by some friends of Gower netted \$2000 for the Warm and Dry Campaign. In addition to the 5 Priorities we are committed to satisfying the recommendation contained in Vision 2025 requiring a triennial review be conducted. David Robbins will be leading this initiative which should also be completed during the Fall. So as you can see it promises to be a very busy Fall – again! This past Summer we also had two students employed at the church. Zach Mosher and Emma Noseworthy both did a great job – Thanks!

Unfortunately we do not have anyone to lead the monthly Seniors Club dinners and have had to delay the start up this year. If you are willing to help out please let the office know and perhaps we can spread the load and ensure we continue this valuable Outreach activity!





# FROM THE ARCHIVES

Committee members at present are James Hiller (Chair), Edward Roberts, Robert Pitt and Linda White.

The committee has the responsibility of collecting and preserving all archival records and artifacts associated with Gower Street Methodist/United church. This means that we have to collect, conserve and store such materials according to professional standards. The committee is also responsible for advising the Board on all matters relating to the church's historical nature, and is consulted about any proposed changes to its physical structure.

This past Summer, the committee received a Canada Summer Jobs grant, which allowed us to hire Zachary Mosher to work in the church archive, which is located in the former Classroom 4. Given his previous experience, Zach was able to review the archives guide and compile an inventory of the records that were in the room. He did not finish, however, so that task may have to be left to 2020. Thanks to Zach, and to Rob Pitt, who donated a computer to the Archive.

We have also received some donations to the archive. Rev. Marion Davis has donated her sermons, while the United Church Women have given us their records, and the Choir has donated boxes of music books. In addition, the Archives and Special Collections Division at Memorial University Library has given us a box of Rev. Kate Crawford's sermons, as well as three oil paintings that were about to be thrown out by the English Language School Board. The committee would be pleased if congregation members would get in contact about any papers that they might hold.

One of the paintings is of J.S. Pitts, a wealthy St. John's Methodist businessman. Another is unknown, and a third is a likeness of the Rev. John Peach, painted fairly recently. The Rev. Peach (1810-1891) worked mainly on the island's south coast and in Conception Bay. He was President of the Newfoundland Conference in 1882-83.
