If we are going to be destroyed by an atomic bomb, let that bomb, when it comes, find us doing sensible and human things – praying, working, teaching, reading, listening to music, bathing the children, playing tennis, chatting to our friends over a pint and a game of darts -- not huddled together like frightened sheep and thinking about bombs."

Yes, that.

Let us still in this unusual time trust in God, serve our neighbor, and enjoy ALL THE AMAZING things that we still have.

Sometimes, I walk into my kitchen and am in awe. There is a stove there that makes it possible to cook things fast. There is a refrigerator that keeps things cold. There is food there and the people I love.

There are puzzles, games, word finds, knitting, movies for snuggle time and books galore. There is a television and other technology which connects me to the world and my family and friends. When I walk outside I am reminded of this beautiful land in which we live, the smell and feel of the fresh, salty air and smiles and waves from neighbors and the beauty of spring peaking through the mountains of snow. I am listening to classical music which I would never have entertained before this time. I am listening to Andrew Lloyd Webber playing live music in his living room every night. How simply awesome is that?

When we focus on loving what we still have, our love for everything grows and it chokes out fear and worry and negativity.

You may have lost something you thought you needed but what if it is making room for you to finally become the person you were meant to be?

I am thinking of all of you during this difficult time. Trust in Jesus. His guidance and unconditional love found in the hope and resurrection of Easter will help you to get on with all those sensible and human things, like reading and walking and cooking and listening to music ... whatever gives you those warm fuzzies ... whatever helps you to find peace in this time of uncertainty!

I wish you many blessings, peace, love and warm and happy thoughts and especially in these moments, the Hope of Easter!



MESSAGE FROM REV. ETTIE & THE PASTORAL CARE COMMITTEE

Since the onset of COVID-19 and all the restrictions that came with it, we have seen a greater need to maintain a pastoral presence with our Gower community. We are especially committed to serving through telephone, electronic means, and old-fashioned mail during this time of social distancing.



Members of the Pastoral Care Committee continues to be in contact with persons in retirement homes and long-term care through family members, telephone, and "Thinking of You" cards. We are also welcoming back Gower members from international travel to determine their wellbeing and safety.

One activity that provided an even greater sense of connectedness within our faith community was providing for an "at-home" Maundy Thursday ritual. At 4:30pm we came together in spirit to share in a simple meal on this Holy Thursday. We reached out to many Gower members through the <u>Ministers' blog</u> and email. We have not devised a way to contact persons without email in a timely manner.

Another planned activity is an invitation to prayer: "a moment for prayer together while apart" at 4:30pm on Thursday 23 April 2020. The prayer to be used for this communal spiritual time is published in What's up at Gower?

While we all hope the pandemic will not last long, in listening to news reports, it seems our efforts to provide pastoral care need to be sustainable for the foreseeable future. With this in mind, the Pastoral Care Committee is seeking to develop a "Gower Contact" ministry to enhance contact with the Gower faith family.

TRANSITION TO NEW BOARD

Gower Street United Church is in the process of transitioning to a new Board structure in 2020. The existing Board, in consultation with the Nominations Committee, has decided to move ahead with an interim organization until we are able to schedule our Annual Congregational meeting (ACM). We need to conduct the regular business of the Church as well as respond to and manage the impacts of the challenges COVID-19 presents. There are a few changes we need to share:

- Lorne LeDrew has stepped down as Chair of the Board and will take on the role of leading a team to respond to COVID-19.
- Patrick Griffin, as recommended by the Nominations Committee, is the new Board Chair until the next ACM.
- The Nominations Committee made the following recommendations, which have been accepted by the Board: "That the following persons be appointed to the designated positions until such time as the 2019 Annual Congregational Meeting is held when the full Nominations Committee Report will be presented for decision-making by the congregation:
 - Chair Worship and Sacraments Committee Angeline Anstey
 - Chair Children/Family Lincoln Addison
 - Chair Outreach Judi Somers
 - Chair Property Ed Moores

- Chair Pastoral Care Tony Chadwick
- Chair Communications Committee Lorne LeDrew
- Non-Board positions: (a) Chair Affirm Advisory Committee Gail Wideman (b) Representative to General Protestant Cemetery Committee – Carl Wright

In naming the above, we recommend that all present Board members and Committee Chairs (unless there was a resignation) remain in place until the next ACM.

The Nominations Committee further recommends that Lorne LeDrew and Tracy Sullivan be appointed to the Board of Trustees."



GOWER GOES LIVE!

We are very excited about "live-streaming" our Sunday Services. Here's why!

Live-streaming enables anyone, anywhere, who cannot be at our services to attend "virtually". So if you are on vacation, or unable to get to church on a given Sunday, especially in this time of physical distancing, you can now "attend" Gower. Even people who have moved away can now return to Gower. We welcome your feedback as we move into this new world! Go to <u>www.gowerunited.com</u> and select the **WATCH – LISTEN** option in the top menu.

Additional Benefits

- We can save our live streamed services for you to access at your convenience. This is especially important for special services such as Easter, Christmas, pageants, band concerts etc.
- We can attract new members to Gower who view our live streamed services to see what they can expect in advance of a visit.
- We can share weekly worship services, regardless of weather through live streaming. We can also include prayer sessions, readings, sermons, or event updates.

How did we set up live streaming? We now have **dedicated broadcasting hardware** that allows us to share live streaming over various online services, including YouTube and Facebook. Only one person is needed to control the camera and the audio and starting and stopping each live stream only takes the push of a button! We had less than \$1000 to establish this vital link with the local and global community. Hopefully we will find a need to expand our capabilities and we are growing our experience to help us make cost effective decisions.

If you're wondering about **privacy**, only those persons playing a direct role in our services will be in the camera's view. Close-ups will be limited. Children who participate in a service will need special parental permission to authorize a close-up view.
