
Sometimes, it can be easy to lose our sense of wonder about God. We may find ourselves going through the motions of our everyday lives and not seeking ways to connect with the Holy on life's journey.

Lent is a time set aside in the Christian year to intentionally be more attentive to God. Not only should it be a season in which we seek the truth of the Gospel to sink in more deeply as we pray and discern the Word, but also a season where we ought to "set our minds on things above, not on earthly things."

Some of us may be giving up (fasting) something for Lent. Whether it be food or a form of entertainment, it is a symbol of our desire to honour God. It resembles and is a reminder of Jesus fasting for forty days in the wilderness before the beginning of his ministry. It echoes the forty days Moses spent on the mountain waiting for the commandments to be given to him and the forty years the Israelites spent in the wilderness. However, some of us may feel the need to do more rather than less: more prayer, more reading of Scripture, more meditation, more journaling, more silence, more rest, more love, more patience.

We invite you to discern, pray and then decide how you will spend these next forty days on the Lenten Path. We pray that it rekindles in you a sense of grace and wonder. As we look towards Good Friday and anticipate the glorious Easter Resurrection, may your days be filled with all that is Holy in your life. May the things that have lost their meaning become new again and closer to your heart. May the most mundane moments of our lives overflow with the wonder of all that is God.

#### The Affirm Committees of Gower Street and St. James United Churches invites you to attend our education session on Gender Inclusive Curricula.

Over the past year, protests and counter-protests have erupted across Canada in response to new developments around gender inclusive curricula.

The United Church of Canada is an inclusive, respectful, and welcoming denomination. We are called to daring justice, which requires us to show up and be allies in spaces where there is inequity. Gower Street and St. James United Churches are Affirming Congregations committed to being Public, Intentional and Explicit in our welcome and presence, believing in a God who loves all individuals and desires an inclusive society. We know that there is misinformation, confusion, and concerns from many, both in our church communities and in the broader society.

In celebration of P.I.E. day[1] and to address and reflect on some of these questions, the Affirm committees from Gower Street and St. James United Churches have planned a joint education event to be held on March 14th at St. James United Church from 5:00 to 7:00. A light supper will be provided. The objective of the event is to provide a safe and respectful space to address questions and concerns about the issue of gender inclusive curricula. The format of the event will include a panel of presenters with lived and professional experience of gender inclusive spaces, practices, and policies. Some examples of questions we will consider are:

- What does it mean when someone says "I identify as [gender diverse]?"
- What can we learn about the experience of identifying in a gender diverse way?
- What is gender inclusive curricula?
- Why is gender inclusive curricula important?
- Why are people opposed to gender inclusive curricula?
- What are parental rights and children's rights in the context of gender inclusive
- curricula?
