Hearing and Listening

Those of us without significant hearing loss routinely take our ability to hear for granted. In fact, our sense of hearing continues to be active even when we are asleep; that's why alarm clocks work. We hear so many things every day, that our brains often tune them out. Just ask anyone who has lived near an airport for years if they still hear every flight like they did when they first moved there. During a recent power outage, my family and I were suddenly aware of all the sounds that stopped... sounds that we weren't even aware of just moments before. The hum of the refrigerator motor, the whisper of air in the ventilation system, and the faint buzz from some electronics all disappeared. We hadn't been listening to them prior to their disappearance, but we were hearing them.

That's the difference between hearing and listening. Hearing is constant, but listening requires focus and attention. We do both or switch between them all the time. When you are driving in a car, you hear the noise of the tires on the road and the wind passing by, but you listen to the radio. When you are in a crowded room, you hear many voices but you listen to the person with whom you are having a conversation.

This year I (on behalf of the GCB) am asking you to listen a little more this season. When you are visiting with family and friends, listen to the people around you, and pay attention to what they are saying. Focus on the lyrics in a song you've heard many times to appreciate the message all over again.

You will hear the band play today. I invite you to focus your attention on some of the components of the band instead of the overall sound occasionally, from the high notes of the flutes to the low notes of the tubas, from the warmth of the French Horn tone to the brilliance of a cymbal crash, and all the instruments in between. There are many individuals you can listen to while hearing the band play, and I think you will find the experience rewarding.

Our first selection has an obvious connection to our theme, but the second one may require some explanation. "Fantasie Noel" is based on *Silent Night* and *Once In Royal David's City*. During the first World War, there was a moment when Allied and German soldiers, squatting in trenches close enough to hear each other, suddenly listened more intently as the sounds of singing rose into the night air. Men on both sides knew the melodies, including *Silent Night*, and joined together in a temporary break in hostilities known as "The Christmas Truce". There is great power in genuine listening. We hope you enjoy our musical offerings.
