Explanation of Matthew 25: 31-46

"Eternal Fire": The 'eternal fire' was a physical place – the dreaded Hinnon Valley called Gehenna, outside of Jerusalem. In Jesus' day it was a garbage dump, outside the city walls, that continually burned. It was considered fit for garbage only since the land had been desecrated by the worship of Moloch (foreign god) in times past. In the first century, in addition to being a garbage dump, Gehenna was a place where bodies of criminals, who did not merit a decent burial, might be dumped – a place where Jesus might have been dumped had someone not intervened. In "Second Coming" theology of the early church, this "eternal fire" of Gehenna was used to symbolize death, and a place for those without hope of redemption in relation to life after death.
