We respectfully acknowledge the land on which we live, work and worship as the ancestral homelands of the Beothuk, whose culture has been lost forever and can never be recovered. We also acknowledge the island of Kaimuki (Newfoundland) as the unceded, traditional territory of the Beothuk and the Mi'kmaq. And we acknowledge Labrador as the traditional and ancestral homelands of the Innu of Nitassinan, the Inuit of Nunatsiavut, and the Inuit of NunatuKavut. We recognize all First Peoples who were here before us, those who live with us now, and the seven generations to come. As First Peoples have done since time immemorial, we strive to be responsible stewards of the land and respect the cultures, ceremonies, and traditions of all who call it home. As we open our hearts and minds to the past, we commit ourselves to working in a spirit of truth and reconciliation to make a better future for all.

The Thanksgiving:

We come to this table with joy and thanksgiving, a celebration of the Love that gathers us here, and that wings its way across the ages.

From the beginning, you, Holy Love, brought into being all life, life in abundance, baptizing it with the waters of creation.

You found a people to bear witness to this love for life. You brought them out of enslavement, brought them through waters to a place of bounty, and gave them a purpose, to be a light to the world.

Remembering Jesus at Table

We celebrate Jesus' birth to ordinary people living in an occupied state, his baptism in the waters of the Jordan into a new commitment to your vision for humanity, his ministry among the hurting and dispossessed people of his day, his happy habit of inviting himself to dinner with anyone and everyone, his communing with vast crowds in outbursts of generosity and sharing, and his challenge to those with power to remember the covenant.

We remember his reinvention of a sacred meal in an upper room long ago, heralding a new liberation, a new naming of family, a new understanding of your communion with humankind, O Holy Love.

After the meal, Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and blessed it, as we do here, and invited his friends to share in the great banquet of love.

Then Jesus took a cup and, in the same way, gave thanks to the earth, workers, and Creator for this gift from the vine.

Jesus filled the cup and invited those around him to enter again into the covenant of love as a sign that Holy Love is stronger than fear and death.

A Prayer of Self-Giving:

In our time and in this place, we do likewise—taking ordinary ingredients and offering them to one another in love as the taste of freedom, togetherness, and eager hope. More than a loaf and a cup, we offer our own selves as living bread to be in the world as Jesus was: yeast, salt, and light for a world more just, more peaceful, more faithful to the vision of security for all, and for a table stretching through all time where people find that which truly nourishes.
