Epiphany Study to Introduce United Church 100th Anniversary Activities: All are invited to an Epiphany Study with Friends of the Foundation (the sponsors) and even friends of the Friends. Panels will be hosted by well-known CBC and United Church communicator, Royal Orr, and are anchored by Brian Arthur Brown, author of THE UNTIED CHURCH OF CANADA and chair of Friends of the Foundation. The first panelists, on January 8, were The Very Rev.
